## Steve,

Here is the data that you asked for. I think I explained this in a previous email but just wanted to make sure you understand what I'm giving you. There is no flag for 1049 treatment so I took M11 crimes that are eligible for 1049 treatment and looked at their sentence. If it was not consistent with a M11 sentence I assumed the offender must have gotten 1049 treatment. I have found some cases (not too many) that have the incorrect ORS so that they aren't really 1049 but might have been an Assault III listed with the incorrect ORS. I believe for the most part the numbers below should be pretty good but they could change a bit as we work on refining the data. Another caveat is that the crime commit date is sometimes missing. When that is the case the age is calculated at the time of sentencing, so there may be some more offenders who were juveniles at the time of the crime but I can't see it in the data. The tables below include the 2<sup>nd</sup> degree M11 crimes and Sex Abuse I. The first table shows the % that get 1049 treatment. The second table shows of those that get 1049 the % that get prison and the % that get probation. Let me know if you have any questions.
